Ways to Use:

This pack introduces children to the curvy uppercase letters: D, P, B, and R. Activities progress from simple prewriting strokes to independent letter formation, giving children confidence at every step.

Materials

- Print on regular paper, card stock, or place in page protectors for reuse.
- Provide crayons (recommended), pencils, or dry erase markers.
- Optional: Pipe cleaners, string, or any other loose parts for hands-on letter building.

Step-by-Step Guide


- 1. Prewriting Sheets (pg. 5-9)
- 2. Bubble Letter Tracing
 - Each letter has a large bubble outline.
 - Encourage sky writing first: draw the letter in the air with a big arm movement, saying the strokes out loud.
 - Children trace inside with a crayon, marker, or alternative material (pipe cleaners, string, play dough, or loose parts).
- 3. Bump Around Practice: Practice getting a good "bump" by going around objects when making D, P, B, and R.
- 4. Progressive Tracing Pages
- Line 1: Two large letters to trace.
- Line 2: Two medium letters to trace.
- Line 3: Two small letters to trace.
- Line 4: Blank guides for independent writing.
- Tip: Some children enjoy calling this "Three Bears Practice"—Papa Bear, Momma Bear, Baby Bear.
- Make it more fun by switching colors each line or letter.
- 5. Independent Practice Page
- Children write on the same handwriting lines without tracing support.
- If your learner isn't ready, use a highlighter or light-colored marker to create your own tracing model.


Teaching Tips

- Model first: "Watch me make an O. Start at the top and go around, all the way back to the top."
- Use verbal cues for consistency, especially for letters like G and Q that add extra strokes.
- Sky writing helps children who need big movements before fine motor control.
- Slip pages into page protectors for repeated practice. Dry erase crayons (or 3-in-1 crayons like Stabilo's) are often easier to control than markers.
- Repetition builds confidence, praise effort and improvement, not just neatness.









Trace top to bottom with the colors of the rainbow. Flip it over and you have a rainbow!




Trace the zigzags.





Trace the zigzags.




Big line down. Jump to the top. Big bump around to the bottom.










Big line down. Jump to the top. Little bump around to the middle.




Trace the Bs and then do your own. Going around the animals and the beans.










Big line down. Jump to the top. Little bump around to the middle. Little Bump to the bottom.




